Description	<p>The Tilghmans were early settlers in Virginia and Maryland. While 2 of the 3 DNA participants in the DNA project may have links to the progenitor (Christopher Tilghman) of Family Group 17, DNA indicates a 0% chance of sharing a common ancestor back 16 generations.
