Description	This family was first mentioned in Ettlingen in 1618, 12 miles south of Karlsruhe. The earliest records held in Salt Lake City were contained in a church record book for the local Catholic Church (the only church in town). The record book began in 1689, likely an earlier one was destroyed when the army of Louis XIV of France devastated this area in that year.
	The first mention of this family referred to them as Tilman. They were listed in a survey of residents of the area and included Johannes Adam Tilman, his wife, Eva Barbara, and legitimate children Christof, Eva Barbara, Anna Maria, Johannes Adam and Johannes Georg. Early records continued to show the surname as Tillmann. On another occasion, Christof is listed as Christof Diehlmann. In later records, Dillmann predominated. However, I will refer to this family as Dillmann.
Facts	Johannes Adam Dillmann died 28 Jun 1720 in Ettlingen aged 70 (born ca. 1650). He first married Eva Barbara Mutschlerin [Mutschler] who died 18 Oct 1715. Johannes Adam married again to Maria Barbara Schweitzerin [Schweitzer] in December 1717. He had no children by his second wife. Johannes Adam and Eva Barbara had the following children:  1a Christof died on 1 Mar 1726 in Ettlingen 1b Eva Barbara 1c Anna Maria 1d Johannes Adam died in Ettlingen in Sep 1710. 1e Johannes Georg died in Ettlingen on 14 Feb 1762 aged 72 (born ca. 1689).
