Alternate names	Johann Carl/John Charles/John C./Charles and John/ John Peter appears to have used Dillmann rather than Dielmann
Date of Immigration	May 1871 (some indexes show May 1872)
Description	Two brothers migrated to the US together, J.C. settling in San Antonio, Texas and the other (Johann) settling in Louisiana, New Orleans.

Notable family members	J.C. Dielman (1849-1923) – stonemason and architect; constructed many buildings in San Antonio, Texas.  Leo Maria Joseph Dielmann (1881-1969) – architect and civic leader; part of a City of San Antonio Chamber of Commerce trade mission to Mexico in 1920. Also his older brother, William Vincent Dielmann, participated in a similar trade mission in 1919. Entry in the Handbook of Texas.  Henry B Dielmann Sr (1892-1970) – Lawyer, noted in the Handbook of Texas.
