Immigrating Ancestor	Philip W. Dielmann

Date of Immigration	According to his obituary, Philip arrived in the United States around 1852.
Description	3 members of this family (2 brothers and a nephew) migrated to the United States, settling in the New Orleans area and took up the confectionary business. 1 brother, Karl Wilhelm, died in 1876, 2 years after marrying and left a very tiny estate. The nephew saw business success from innovations in candy manufacturing but also suffered business disappointments. Phillip W, the first to arrive, had the most success, particularly outside the confectionary business and had wide ranging interests. At the time of his death in 1897, he left a significant estate that was tied up in the New Orleans and Louisiana court systems for several decades. Facts	Phillip W. was naturalized on 30 Oct 1878. Karl Wilhelm died on 28 Aug 1876. Phillip W. died on 18 Jul 1897. Charles Phillip died on 20 Oct 1903. All in New Orleans, Louisiana.
