Description	<p>This is an interesting case. The passenger list clearly lists Susanne Dillmann and 2 Dillmann sons. Ahead of her on the list was Michel Vetter. Looking at the birth records in Germany shows that she had several illegitimate children. On some birth/baptism records, her father, Philipp is shown as the children's father, on some Michael Vetter is shown as the father.</p> <p>After arriving in the United States, the children (and family) seem to have used the surname Vetter exclusively. She does seem to have married Michael Vetter eventually on 14 Oct 1860, in Ettlingen, Baden, Germany.</p> <p>She may be part of the Ettlingen Dillmanns, Family Group 14.</p>
Facts	Susanna (Dillmann) Vetter died on 23 Dec 1915 1 day shy of her 91 st birthday of 24 Dec 1824 (according to her NY death certificate).
