Description	<p>Hans Georg Dillmann was born in Neureut, Baden, Germany and at the age of 27 sailed with his wife, 2 children and a daughter on the way from Rotterdam, Netherlands for Philadelphia on the ship Brothers. 2 significant (111+ acres) land grants + 2 smaller ones (30 acres) were set out under the names of George Tillman/George Stilman in 1754 in Swatara Township, Lebanon County (then Lancaster County). George Dillman was noted as a key witness called in the matter of the stabbing and beheading of one neighbour by another in 1759. All 4 pieces of land were disposed of in 1767, perhaps indicating an early death.</p> <p>Hans Georg has approximately 8,000 descendants.</p>
