Description	<p>Georg Friedrich Dihlmann was born October 12, 1735 in Wurmberg Germany. He sailed from Rotterdam on the ship Neptune bound for America and arrived in Philadelphia, PA October 07, 1755. Erich Dihlmann's family history research states that Georg's brother Balthasar (Baltes) also came to America but it has not been determined whether the two came at the same time. No mention was made of Balthasar in the immigration records which listed Georg Friedrich nor have any others been found.</p> <p>Marianne Dihlmann Fritz and Richard Fritz created a Dihlmann Family Tree in 1984 which shows family members from early 1500 to 1984 and it was based upon research provided by Erich Friedrich Dihlmann. At least four copies of this tree exist in Germany. Marianne Fritz gifted one copy to Rodney Holmes Dillman of Troutville VA in 2012 when he and his wife visited Wurmberg Germany. Photos of this extensive family tree are used frequently on the Dillman Family Association website.</p>
Facts	The research of Betsy Dillman Ross revealed that Georg Friedrich Dihlmann married Catarina and the couple had five children, Elisabeth, Friedrich, Christopher, George and Solomon. Birth records for the children were registered by St. Michael's and Zion Lutheran Church, Philadelphia PA and also published in "Pennsylvania Births Philadelphia County 1644-1765".

August (see below) and Christian Heinrich Dillmann (1829-1899) founder of the Dillmann Gymnasium in Stuttgart, Germany.</p> <p>Christian Friedrich August Dillmann (August), PHD was born April 25, 1823 and died July 4, 1894. August Dillman was an Ethiopic scholar and Old Testament exegete (interpreter and explainer).</p>
Farthest back ancestor	Michael Georg Dhyllmann
Birthplace/residence of farthest back ancestor	Michael Georg Dhyllmann was born sometime around 1500 in the Kraichgau area of Germany and he died in Wurmberg, Germany. He was "examined" in 1536 in Wurmberg which was done to determine if he was suited for the military. He

	was mustered as a spear carrier in 1536. In 1553 he was listed in the Wurmberg warehouse book with his tributary estates, (Main Archive, Stuttgart H 102-49, Volume 231)
