| Description                                    | This is a Jewish family from Odessa who migrated to the US in the early 1900's joining family members (daughter and son-in-law Rose and Jacob) already in the US, the Kausners who eventually became Kushners. Residing with the Kushners in the 1910 US Census for New York were other family members, Morris, Elias, and Adeline Dulman, siblings and likely cousins/siblings of Rose. However, given the difficulty with Hebrew name variations and difference in surname interpretation by record keepers, teasing out exact family relationships can be particularly challenging. These 2 families (Kushners and Dillman/Dulmans) relocated to Boston between 1910 and 1915. |
| Facts  | Morris/Mojsche Dulman/Speck in his Nov 1916 declaration of intention to become a US citizen notes that he arrived in New York on 27 Mar 1904, that he was born on 1 Jan 1882, married with Beckie/Betty, is a tailor, residing on 127 Humboldt Street, Boston. With his naturalization, Morris changed his surname to Speck and seems to have been using his wife, Betty's maiden name as his surname initially. Morris Speck died on 25 Jan 1960 in Florida.  Morris Dulman, b.ca. 1886, son of Ase Dulman and Sarah Kaufman, married Anna Rockman on 11 Jul 1915 in Boston, Massachusetts. He died on 17 Nov 1943 and is buried in  |
