Description	This family were from the Amsterdam area, North Holland, Netherlands and could possibly be connected to the Deelman family of Groningen, Netherlands (Family Group 73) but at this point no documentation has been located.
	One branch of this family migrated to South Africa around 1875 (Franciscus Petrus Salomon Deelman) while another migrated to Canada in 1925 (Janus Theodoor).
	Janus worked for many years for the Massey-Harris Co, manufacturer of farm equipment in Toronto, Canada, as a purchaser and travelled on business often to New York.
	This South African family were picked up from records showing business related travel from South Africa to London, England, Canada and Australia. Franciscus Petrus Salomon Deelman appears to have been a banker with some level of seniority which resulted in relocations to various offices, etc.
Facts	Franciscus Petrus Salomon Deelman was born Dec 1848 in Amsterdam (his death certificate indicates a date of death of 16 Oct 1891 in Winburg, Free State, South Africa, with his age as being 42 years and 10 months).
	Janus Theodoor Deelman was born 4 Jan 1903 in Rotterdam to Bertha Wilhelmina Deelman.
	Johan Arend Deelman and Klara Hendriena van den Wollenberg were married on 8 Nov 1872 at Nieuwer–Amstel, Netherlands

Notable family members	There was an Oxford scholarship set up in 1965 in the name of Christian Felling Deelman, that being the Christian Deelman Travel Fund. Sadly, he died of a sudden illness not long after on 31 Jul 1964 at the age of 26.
