Date of Immigration	Jean and Eva Dillmann are recorded as arriving in New York on the ship City of Brussels on 10 Dec 1872.
Description	This family were recorded as living for a time in Alsace, France when the Franco-Prussian War ended and were included in a registration of residents. Jean and Eva's registrations were completed by their parents, noting that they were currently residing in New York.
Facts	<p>Jean Dillmann was born 1 Sep 1850 at Schoenebourg, France as noted in the registration of citizens from 1872.</p> <p>John Dillman died 20 Nov 1884, as noted by the Missouri Death records. Genevieve (Eva) predeceased him in Aug 1881. Both are buried in the Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Cemetery in Saint Louis, Missouri.</p> <p>Their children, twins, Michael and Anna, died 18 Jun 1880, aged 6 months of marasmus (dehydration and infection caused by scarcity of nutrition) are also likely buried in the Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Cemetery, Saint Louis.</p>
