Date of Immigration	According to his petition for naturalization, Frank E. Dielmann arrived in New York in Mar 1883.
Description	Frank Dielmann was initially a cabinet maker, then a piano maker and later become a saloon keeper. His son, Emil, later moved to Chester, Connecticut, where he was buried and included his parents, Frank and Katherine Maier Dielmann on his grave marker. It isn't clear whether Frank and Katherine are likewise buried in Saint Joseph's Cemetery
